The Christian Community recognizes Christ's deed of life and death as the pivot of renewal in humanity's history. He brought a new relationship between human beings on earth and the beings of the spiritual world. Through His indwelling in the sacraments - this revitalising impulse continues to be available to us individually and in community.

Christ replenishes our life in sacramental community, which in turn offers us as individuals the opportunity to find and connect with his regeneration impulse in our own lives, in the life of the whole humanity - and in the life of the entire earth.

There are approximately 350 independent Christian Community congregations worldwide with 17 congregations in Great Britain and Ireland.

The Christian Community was founded 1922 in Switzerland and 1929 in Great Britain.

The Sacraments.

The sacraments are Christ's way of speaking to us. Through them, we connect to his deed of life and death at important junctures in our lives. They nourish and support our earthly existence. There are seven Sacraments in The Christian Community.

The Act of Consecration of Man, our communion service, is the centre of our sacramental life. In addition, there are six other sacraments that give renewal and direction to the natural course of our lives.

Baptism receives the child into the congregation, represented particularly by two godparents. Confirmation takes place at the age of fourteen to strengthen and support a young person's path into life.

Marriage blesses the decision of a couple to share community of life, supported by two chosen witnesses.

The Anointing, along with the funeral service, helps the dying to free themselves from the body and move into body-free spiritual life.

Sacramental Consultation (by request and confidential) is religious counselling for one's life destiny. It can support individual efforts to take responsibility for life.

Sacrament of Ordination. The sacraments are performed by the priest through the power conferred by the Sacrament of Ordination. In The Christian Community both men and women can become priests.
