The plant grows, matures and dies, but before this cycle is complete, seeds are dispersed, and a new plant germinates.

So – we have been growing for a hundred years, and what are the fruits of our development, and how might these look in the future? What are we hoping to renew, and perhaps more importantly, what new developments might emerge to carry us into the next decade and beyond?

This year's annual conference will give us chance to consider these questions, working mainly in conversation groups, and will hopefully provide very real growth points for us to take back to our local communities.


