

The Prologue of the Gospel of John describes how all things came into being through the Word. This becomes daily practice in the use of the formative power of the Word in eurythmy therapy. In the lecture cycle about eurythmy therapy Rudolf Steiner shows how human beings with body, soul and spirit came from the cosmos, realize themselves on the earth, and how they can find a new relationship to their divine origin through Eurythmy. Dr. Wilburg Keller Roth will introduce these concepts and Annamaria Balog will share with us experiences through eurythmy deepening the lectures.

'As in the ordinary day, morning is the beginning, and evening the close of day, so, their [angels] knowledge of the primordial being of things is called morning knowledge; and this is according as things exist in the Word. But their knowledge of the essential being of the thing created, as it stands in its own nature, is termed evening knowledge; because the being of things flows from the Word, as from a kind of primordial principle; and this flow is fulfilled in the being which they have in themselves.' Thomas Aquinas, summa theologica I, 58,6

Dr. Wilburg Keller Roth trained as a medical doctor in Vienna and at the Lukas Clinic, Ita Wegman Clinic and Sonnenhof in Arlesheim and works as a GP in Basel since 1996. She has been teaching students of curative education, eurythmy and eurythmy therapy for many years in Dornach/Arlesheim as well as in Budapest, Prague, Vienna and St. Petersburg and has been involved in further education for Eurythmy Therapists and Medical Doctors in Germany, Switzerland, England, Finland, Austria, Czech Republic and France.

She has contributed to major conferences at the Goetheanum and published articles in journals both for anthroposophic medicine and eurythmy. In 2021 her book on 'System and Method of Eurythmy Therapy' was published at the Verlag am Goetheanum (not yet translated into English)

Annamaria Balog studied Philosophy and Psychology in Transylvania in her native country Romania. Her path led to England in Autumn 2011 when she trained as an eurythmist at the West Midlands Eurythmy Training in Stourbridge. After graduating, she began her journey as an eurythmy teacher at Elmfield, the local Steiner school. In 2016 she joined the part-time eurythmy therapy training, then held in Stroud, and graduated as a eurythmy therapist in 2018. Since then she has been working primarily as a eurythmy teacher, occasionally helping out with teaching eurythmy students at the local eurythmy training, and has worked with eurythmy therapy with both children and adults at Elmfield and at the local Elysia Therapy Centre.

Erhard Keller studied Business Administration in Vienna and Curative Education and Social Therapy in Hamburg and Bad Boll. He used to work in curative education and social therapy in Loch Arthur Camphill Community in Scotland, Cotswold Chine Home School in Gloucestershire, in Kinderheim Friedrichshulde, Hamburg and Tiphereth, Edinburgh, before becoming a priest in 2008. He has worked as priest in Stroud, Bristol, South Devon, and since 2015 in Ilkeston and Stourbridge.
