
The guideline price is intended to make it possible to offer some help for those with less means. In order to do this, we ask you to pay more if you can.

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Our present time is not lacking in revelation. We celebrate the Act of Consecration of Man as part of the ongoing revelation of Christ. Making this real for ourselves is the central task of members of The Christian Community. The Act of Consecration itself creates the faculties which we need: to see the events that unfold at the altar as a living icon; to hear the divine Word within the words that are spoken; to experience the encounter with the spiritual world at the altar.

When the candles are lighted at the beginning of the service, the space in which the service is to unfold is created before our eyes. This is an echo of Whitsun, when the flame entered the Upper Room and divided before coming to rest. When the bell sounds, the space created by the light becomes a sounding space, purified by the single tone of the bell. These acts are not merely formal: they ask us to create a space within ourselves and become open for the words that will resound. In this space, an encounter with Christ can take place.

All of this is summed up in the words from our Creed that describe members of the Community as those 'who feel the Christ within themselves'.

Exchanging experiences and practising the kind of concentrated participation that the sacraments ask for can help us on our path. Members of The Christian Community are given a rich treasure: the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Gospels. We will work with these three elements, with presentations and discussion and also in small groups. There will be an artistic activity at each of the weekends.

We hope that this Schooling Course will deepen membership for those who have already become members, and open a pathway to membership for those who are interested. The weekends are designed to give participants something to carry on working with.
