

One of the changes in human understanding over the last century has been the increasing recognition that there may be other forms of consciousness than our own. Advances in cosmology and quantum mechanics, the many near-death experiences and other moments when people experience a 'flip' in their consciousness (Jeffrey Kripal), suggest that the old picture of human beings as completely alone in a world of mechanical causes needs to be revised.

One of the pioneers of this new consciousness was Rudolf Steiner. His many descriptions of higher minds invite us to develop methods of knowing that allow us to see ourselves from ever wider perspectives. We can practise such knowledge through simple exercises. What we gain from understanding the spiritual hierarchies can serve to enrich our lives and deepen our experience in the Act of Consecration of Man.
