Following the successful conclusion of our charity restructuring project, we have made the historic decision to simplify our governance structure. We have retired the names

'Council of Management' 'Executive and Committee' and now conduct our business in regular Trustees' Meetings. This tailoring of our structure better suits our current tasks.

At our October meeting, we performed our essential review functions, including looking at the quarterly accounts and agreeing on budgets for the forthcoming year.

legacies. In line with our principle, the Devon congregation received the first £10,000 of a legacy and additional funds to support much-needed structural repairs to their building. The balance of the funds will address national needs.

In property news:

- We are engaged in ongoing discussions about repairs needed at the Stroud church.
- We successfully sold a property in Stourbridge, which allows us to search for a new property in Forest Row, where we are currently paying high rental costs for a priest's accommodation.

The Lenker reported that the major round of priests' moves for the year has been completed successfully.

We are planning a meeting of the Treasurers on June 13, 2026. The next meeting of the Trustees is scheduled for February 2026.
